## **RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF EXCEL NO. 71**

## **BYLAW NO. 7-2022**

## A BYLAW TO REGULATE AND CONTROL THE DUMPING OF WASTE ON LAND UNDER THE OWNERSHIP OR CONTROL OF THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF EXCEL NO. 71

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Excel No. 71, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

- 1. This bylaw shall be referred to as the Litter Control Bylaw.
- 2. In this bylaw, the following definitions apply:
  - a) "Dumping" means abandoning waste or causing waste to be abandoned in any location other than in a receptacle provided for the purpose of receiving the waste or recyclables;
  - b) "Municipality" means the Rural Municipality of Excel No. 71;
  - c) "Waste" means any discarded or abandoned organic or inorganic material, including, but not limited to, rubbish, tailings, effluent, sewage, garbage, refuse, scrap, discarded articles, bottles, or cans, and any other material that is prescribed or set out in the code, as per *The Environmental Management and Protection Act, 2010.*
- 3. Pursuant to Section 50 of *The Environmental Management and Protection Act, 2010*, dumping waste on land under the ownership or control of the municipality is prohibited and any person found guilty of this offence shall be liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided pursuant to Section 84 of *The Environmental Management and Protection Act, 2010*.
- 4. In addition to any penalty assessed, a person convicted of an offense pursuant to this bylaw shall also be responsible for the cost incurred by the municipality for waste disposal and clean-up at an hourly rate and:
  - a) The charge shall not be less than a three and one half (3.5) hour minimum.
  - b) The hourly rate shall be calculated as the sum of the following:
    - i) Labour cost for two employees at the current rate for the road crew operators.
    - ii) Equipment cost for a 10yd Tandem Truck at the municipality's current Custom Work Rate.

- 5. Bylaw No. 3-15 is hereby repealed.
- 6. This bylaw shall come into force on the day of its final passing.
