

NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC

INTENT TO DISSOLVE ORO LAKE REGIONAL PARK AUTHORITY

Public notice is hereby given that, pursuant to subsection 21(2) of *The Regional Parks Act, 2013*, the Ministry of Parks, Culture and Sport is preparing to dissolve the Oro Lake Regional Park Authority, due to inactivity and at the request of the sponsoring bodies. The Oro Lake Regional Park Authority was originally established by Order in Council No. 752/65, dated May 11, 1965.

The Authority comprises the following municipalities:

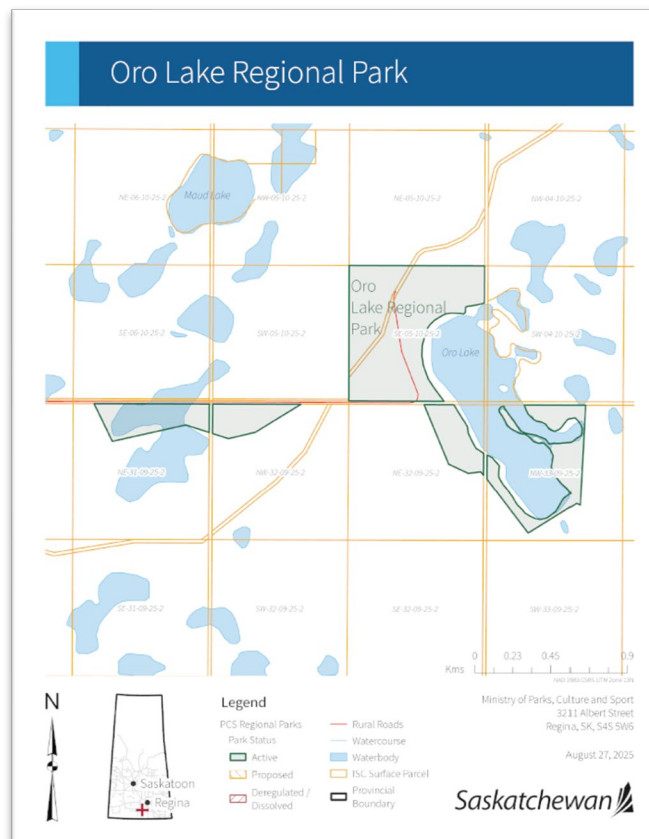
- Rural Municipality of Excel No. 71
- Rural Municipality of Terrell No. 101
- Village of Spring Valley (*The village was dissolved and subsequently incorporated into the Rural Municipality of Terrell No. 101.*)

Dissolution is considered to be in the public interest for the following reasons:

- The regional park can no longer offer natural, cultural, or recreational amenities to Saskatchewan residents.
- The sponsoring municipalities, Rural Municipality of Excel No. 71 and Rural Municipality of Terrell No. 101, have passed formal resolutions requesting the dissolution of the park.
- All assets and liabilities associated with the regional park have been resolved.
- The board of the Oro Lake Regional Park Authority has been inactive for several years, and the authority is currently not in compliance with *The Regional Parks Act, 2013*.

Public access to existing camping and recreational amenities will remain unchanged, as the Rural Municipality of Terrell No. 101 will continue to manage the area as a municipal park. The Crown Resource Land Lease will be assigned to the RM of Terrell No. 101 and the regional park owned land will be transferred to the RM of Terrell No. 101.

Dissolving the park has no impact on land ownership, only jurisdictional standing. A map of the regional park is below.



Individuals wishing to oppose the proposed dissolution may submit a written objection outlining the reasons for their opposition.
